As we move closer to Holy Week, before we celebrate Jesus' resurrection on Easter, we remember His death on Good Friday. Paul says in Romans 6:3-4: "Do you not know that all of us who have been baptized into Christ Jesus were baptized into his death? We were buried therefore with him by baptism into death, in order that, just as Christ was raised from the dead by the glory of the Father, we too might walk in newness of life."

We rightly highlight the importance of Jesus' substitutionary death - His death in our place - and His resurrection: that as Christ has risen, we can receive eternal life. However, our identification with Christ in His death and resurrection goes even deeper than that. Paul later writes in Romans 12:1-2, "I appeal to you therefore, brothers, by the mercies of God, to present your bodies as a living sacrifice, holy and acceptable to God, which is your spiritual worship. Do not be conformed to this world, but be transformed by the renewal of your mind, that by testing you may discern what is the will of God, what is good and acceptable and perfect."

Jesus' death is more than a means by which our sins are forgiven - it is also a pattern for us to follow. This pattern extends beyond a willingness to suffer or even die for our faith. Paul's command to present our bodies as a living sacrifice includes the ongoing call to repent from sin - something the Holy Spirit is both willing and able to help us with.

Though the cross was the ultimate dying to self, Jesus modeled a life of daily sacrifice. There were things He could have done with His time on earth that He gave up for the sake of the mission the Father gave Him. If we are to identify with Jesus in His death and resurrection, there are things we too will be called to put to death.

Recently the Holy Spirit led me to make some adjustments in how I use my free time. He prompted me to turn the TV off and go to bed earlier so that I could get the rest needed - to stay healthy and to begin my morning quiet time with Him earlier. This wasn't the first or the last time the Spirit led me to make changes - to "put something to death" in order to make room for something better.

What might the Holy Spirit be asking you to put to death in order to make room for new life? Perhaps there is a hobby or material focus that has pushed your life out of balance. Perhaps He is leading you to step away from political consumption. Often, the Spirit leads individual believers to give up - or limit - things that may not be sinful, but have become distractions or even idols.

This offering of ourselves is not a one-time event, but a daily act of worship. The specifics of what we are called to lay down will vary in different seasons of life. But in doing so, we position ourselves to identify with Christ not only in His death, but also in His resurrection and life. We allow Him to clear the clutter from our lives so that we can better discern His will and be ready for the work He calls us to.

Hope to see you on April 24th.




#### WHAT'S YOUR TRIGGER?
