Take My Life and Let It Be by Frances Ridley Havergal



"Take My Life and Let It Be" was written by Frances after she felt that something was missing in her Christian experience and walk. In 1873 she read the book *"All for Jesus"* and desired that Christ be the King in all of her life. On Advent Sunday, December 1873, she saw the 'blessedness of true consecration' and gave full surrender of her life. She became a witness to others and wrote this particular hymn. This was the date of her consecration. As a secular vocalist, she decided that she no longer should perform professionally and began to sing only as a sacred musician. She gave away her wealth and money to the church missionary society and had a complete consecration of her talents, wealth, and life. She kept only a brooch from her family. This hymn is based on Philippians 3:8.

- Take my life and let it be Consecrated Lord to Thee. Take my hands and let them love, At the impulse of Thy love, at the impulse of Thy love.
- Take my feet, and let them be Swift and beautiful for thee. Take my voice, and let me sing Always, only for my King. Always, only for my King.
- 3. Take my lips, and let them be Filled with messages for thee. Take my silver and my gold, Not a mite would I withhold, Not a mite would I withhold.
- Take my love, my God I pour At Thy feet its treasure store. Take myself and I will be Ever, only all for Thee. Ever, only, all for Thee.

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DON'T YOU QUIT By Rev. Paul Cope, Assistant District Superintendent

I hope you are enjoying summer to the fullest. I love these warm days, and opportunity to do my favorite sport...swimming. There are so many spiritual implications here. Let me show you some:

Probably the best reason I like to swim on a hot day, it is very *refreshing*. Just to dive into a nice cool lake or pool is very relaxing to me. Well do I remember the year a group of us went to Ecuador, South America on a mission trip. The weather there was very hot, well over 110 degrees each day. After doing construction work at Camp Nehemiah, most of the group who were with us walked down to the sandy beach of the Pacific Ocean. Within minutes, the cool waves were cooling our tired and overheated bodies. It was refreshing. God wants to refresh us: in our physical bodies . . . but also in our spiritual lives. It is good to plunge into the ". . . water of the (Ephesians word" 5:26). God's word wonderfully refreshes us. This summer be sure to read His word, the Bible, every day. It is refreshing to our souls.

Swimming requires **discipline**, powerful kicking of the feet, long strokes with the hands, and rhythmic breathing, coordinated together. It is a skill we must learn. I'm thankful for my dad who loved to swim himself, but also made time in his busy life to teach me how to really enjoy swimming. He influenced me for good. Each of us can influence others for good and have fun doing it.

With swimming, *you can't quit*, mid-stream. Once a swimmer dives into the water he must be committed to getting to the other side. It requires commitment, even when your muscles ache from the exertion . . . or when you are out of breath. Christian living is a lot about commitment. A little plaque I picked up at my daughter's garage sale reads:

> Don't quit! When things go wrong, As they sometimes will, When the road you're trudging

Seems all up hill, When the funds are low, And the debts are high, And you want to smile, But you have to sigh. When care is pressing you down a bit Rest if you must, But don't you quit!

Romans 8:18: "For I consider that the sufferings of this present time are not worthy to be compared with the glory which shall be revealed in us."

With swimming, you must get **totally involved**. Just putting your feet into the water isn't swimming, it's called wading. You can't swim without getting your whole body into the sport. Sometimes Connie tries to swim without getting her hair wet... it's quite a sight... but not very relaxing. As for me, I just dive in and enjoy!

In the Christian life, like in swimming, get totally involved, stay committed, help others learn, and stay refreshed so that you and those you influence for good will experience "... the glory which shall be revealed in us."
