Christians Give Good Council

"The Lord has given to each Christian the Holy Spirit who dwells within us to be with us forever. The Holy Spirit is referred to as "The Counselor" among other titles. So when you give counsel to another person, the Lord makes you "competent to counsel' since His Spirit lives within you.

Unlike God, you are not infallible, but you can give solid directions to another person in need of guidance. Here are some core dimensions of helping another person given by Dr. Paul Holland of Geneva College.


- 1. Be empathic. See the world from the point of view of the person you are helping. Feel what they feel. God gave them those emotions. "Weep with those who weep, rejoice with those who rejoice" (Romans 14).
- 2. Respect the person in the trial. They have been made in God's image and Jesus has died for them. God gives them dignity and neither sin, nor troubles, nor the devil can take that away.
- 3. Be genuine. You are secure in Christ so your strength in the Lord along with your limitations should be clearly seen by your friend. God has given you a big heart to handle criticism, opposition, and difference of opinions from those you are attempting to help. "Open wide your heart" (2 Cor. 6).
- 4. Confront. Help the person hear the Lord and face their avoidance of Him. Ask, "What might you tell a family member if they were facing what you face?" Invite the person to love and obey God immediately. Knowing they are loved by God helps a person confidently take actions needed.
- 5. Share how you have struggled in similar trials. Briefly speak of how you have been overcome by troubles in the past. Don't make the conversation about you, but help the person see the Lord has brought you through the storm and He will bring them through the storm also. But do this without

minimizing the person's present pain. (2 Cor. 10:11-13).

God's calling for you in service to Him is to have Him counsel through you. "Stir one another on to love and good deeds, and encourage one another". (Hebrews 10)

Elisabeth Elliot is a wife, mother, grandmother, speaker, writer, missionary, friend, counselor, teacher, etc., etc. Most of us remember her as the wife of Jim Elliot, the missionary who was killed by the Auca Indians in Ecuador in the 1950's. (He was one of five missionaries who was killed. If you have not read the story, you need to read "Through Gates of Splendor", and "Shadow of the Almighty")


Trusting God in a Twisted World and other Reflections on Asking God Why is one of the many other books that Elisabeth wrote. "We are reminded that as children of God we can bring our questions to him with all the trust of a child in his earthly parent. When we overcome our fears and decide to ask God why, He will surely give us all the answers we need. The refusal of grace is like the refusal to put oil in an engine. The Christian's distinctive mark is love. We are here not to pester God but to adore Him." (As this writer was reading the mentioned book this summer, she also read in "Christianity Today" that Mrs. Elliot-Leitch passed into the presence of her heavenly Father.)

Bill Hybels, pastor of Willow Creek Community Church in South Barrington, Illinois, writes in his book **Just Walk Across the Room** of th simple steps to pointing people to faith in Christ. Most of us have excuses for evangelism. Mr. Hybel says that all we need is a heart that is in tune with the Holy Spirit and a willingness to venture out and be a friend to another person and join in his/her life. Our example of course, Jesus. Remember your own redemption story. Someone reached out to you. We know that people are watching us all the time. When an opportunity comes your way, be prepared in advance to use those minutes, or seconds, to let people know that God is love. That is the number one priority. Do not be condemning, or judgmental. Pray. Pray. Pray.

<u>Called for Life</u> is the fabulous retelling of Dr. Kent Brantly's struggle with the Ebola disease in 2014. Both Kent and his wife Amber share their story, their fears, their faith, their fight with network

news, their family concerns, and their hopes to return to the mission field one day. From the very beginning they knew the dangers on the field; they never expected it to be so severe. Their testimony has spoken to thousands and given opportunity to express the Lord's faithfulness and healing despite epidemic proportions. (Book has been placed in the church library)

A few statistics that blew this writer's mind: 26,575 children die each day of largely preventable causes related to their poverty; 350-400 MILLION children are hungry; a child dies EVERY 5 SECONDS. This is only some of the information from The Hole in Our Gospel: What Does God Expect of Us? by Richard Stearns, President of Worship Vision. Mr. Stearns was introduced to us from a previous Koinonia article. He has a heart to help hurting people, especially children. He has written; "Children, 'people' are NOT statistics to God. Every child is precious." African pastor, Morgan Chilulu, has said: "A church that lives within its four walls is no church at all." So what does that message tell us? ? At Norwin Alliance we have several outreach programs. AND THAT IS GREAT!!! Keep it up and PRAY that people are blessed by those ministries. "Faith is the fuel that powers the light that shines in darkness." We have the best message to share with the boys and girls, men and women who enter the doors of Norwin Alliance. Let's be ready to bless them, pray with them, and tell them that Jesus loves them! ! (The book belongs to Pastor Bob)





Curriculum:

We just completed our study *A lliance Distinctives*, exploring these issues:

"What does it mean to be *Alliance*? What do we believe and why do we believe it? How do these beliefs define our identity and drive our activity? What are the common threads that tie us together to other Alliance people around the world? Through this study, we were encouraged to discover and embrace God's plans, purposes, and empowerment for our lives."

SUGGESTED GIFTS:
