In 1978 President Jimmy Carter signed a proclamation for National Grandparents Day. A lady named Marian McQueen from Oak Hill, West Virginia introduced this day for the purpose of honoring grandparents and to give grandparents an opportunity to show love to their grandchildren. Children are to become aware of the strength, information and guidance that older people can offer to them. By the time a child has become mature and an adult, it is important that he/she has had training and LOVE that has been a positive influence.

National Grandparents Day is celebrated the first Sunday of September after Labor Day. There is a special song. The flower is the forget-me-not".

I said to Bill, "Don't you wonder what they're trying to find in the yard?" His response was "Seeds I guess." They pounded the ground with their beaks, sometimes fluttering their wings. We sat fascinated by their actions when suddenly one of the crows had something in its beak and started throwing it around and hitting the ground with it. We couldn't tell exactly what it was, but we were sure it was a small animal, like a shrew or mole. After they were sure it was dead the two crows, one of which had this tasty morsel dangling from its beak, flew off across our neighbors' yards and up into the trees. It wasn't long before we heard the sound of a young crow making noises akin to a crying baby. Well, it was evident it was going to get a nice meaty dinner harvested right in our own yard. Bill and I looked at each other in astonishment because we had never witnessed this and had never heard that this was typical crow behavior. I always think of crows eating road kill or the eggs of other birds. Well, we were tickled pink to see and learn something new first hand. I have a friend who calls these kinds of experiences "a God moment." I agree because the first thing I think of is "Thank you God for showing me your creation." I believe that God lets these little scenes play out in front of us as a

special treat. It's like God is saying, "Watch what My creation is capable of. I will show you something you have never seen before and it will be a gift from Me to I treasure these moments and count them as precious. The things God has created are so numerous and wondrous I can scarcely imagine them. How can there not be a Creator of the universe when everything is so intricately put together. 
