
KOINONIA

"The grace of the Lord Jesus Christ, and the love of God, and the fellowship (Koinonia) of the Holy Spirit be with you all." 2 Corinthians 13:14



When Jesus gives instructions related to prayer, we should take note. One of those passages is Matthew 9:37-38, "The harvest is plentiful, but the laborers are few; therefore pray earnestly to the Lord of the harvest to send out laborers into his harvest." We rightly emphasize our individual need to be witnesses in our own personal lives as we all have unique opportunities within our circles of influence. Of course, Jesus wants us to be one of these laborers! And yet, the laborers are few and Jesus is connecting prayer to the need for laborers. How should this imperative affect our prayer lives?

First, is who we are praying to. God is the Lord of the harvest. This ties in with the Lord's prayer, that His kingdom would come. We are asking for His rule and reign to break into the world. His Spirit has prepared hearts that are ready to respond to the gospel. He's the one who sends out workers.

Second, our prayers for laborers are to be earnest. Our prayer life is not either/or, but as we earnestly lift up our own needs and the needs of those close to us, we must also be earnest to pray for the advancement of the kingdom, the church's mission. Otherwise, we can become stuck in an it-is-well-with-my-soul mindset. The assurance of our future eternity in heaven should be a comfort in the hard seasons of life. However, earnest prayer for the church's mission and laborers shapes us and reorients our own awareness of the harvest field around us. The Father desires other souls to be made well and His Spirit is

actively making hearts ready to be respond. Both our eternal security and seeing God's Kingdom advance now are our comforts when trials come.

Finally, we pray specifically for God to send and use others we know. While we can and should offer this general prayer for God to be raising up laborers, we should also pray for specific people—maybe some of the same people that we are lifting up for their own needs and trials. We can mistakenly place people in one of two prayer categories: those who have physical, relational, mental, and other personal needs, and those we think are "in a good place to be sent." But, what if these two lists were one? What if those of us who are in a trying season of life are also perfectly positioned to be used to advance the kingdom? Trials do create limitations, but they also position us to be witnesses to others that we wouldn't be in proximity with otherwise.

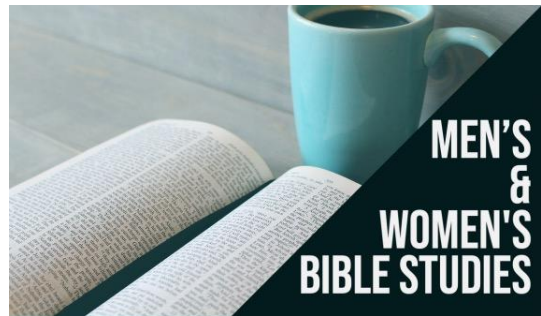

Sept 3, we will begin our new AWANA year with a-MAZE-ing Grace night at 6:45. Kids ages 2 years - 5th grade are invited to attend.

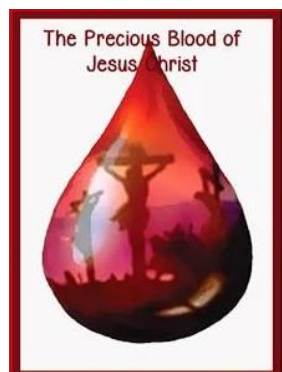

ALRIGHTY, , , I RECKON that the suffering of this present time are not worthy to be compared with glory which shall be revealed in us. Romans 8:18 KJV. Sometimes unexpected diagnoses arrive, and we are yanked off the narrow path. Though the scenery changes, it remains the narrow path. Learning the double-edged sword of chemo, I find that the patients' blood levels are checked to see if they can handle this treatment. One component in the blood is hemoglobin. If it is too low, chemo is postponed until a blood infusion is done. We found ourselves in the infusion center learning about this process. My thoughts meandered to Calvary and His shed blood. Our particular blood had been triple cross checked and was under refrigeration. Finally, the precious life strengthening blood "pouch" arrived and was "hung" and began its slow journey. The name on the pouch was "Volunteer Donor", I was so humbled and near tears. I prayed for this individual and asked God to somehow bless them. Over the next 3 hours, I was mesmerized by the rhythmic drip of the beautiful crimson life blood into the small tube, representative of Christ's shed blood (I'm sure the color remains the same). It was crazy to me, for what had brought us to this path became a comforting time with the Lord.

Beautiful hymns, singing of the crimson blood: *"When I See the Blood", "Nothing but the Blood", "The Precious Blood", "Washed in the Blood", "There is Power in the Blood".*

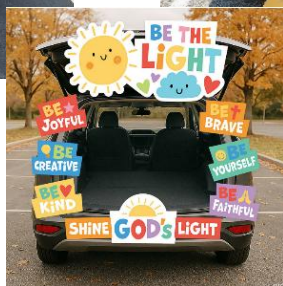

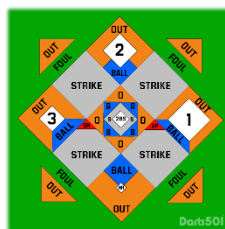


“Trunk & Treat” is a family friendly, safe alternative to traditional trick-or-treating.

If you work with our children and youth, updated background clearances and child abuse clearances need to be turned into the church office before you can start.

Criminal Background Check:

Click on “New Volunteer Record Check”

Make sure you print out the “No Record” or “Record” response and return a copy to the office and you keep a copy in your files.

Child Abuse Clearance:

<https://www.compass.dhs.pa.gov/cwis>

Make sure you indicate this is for Volunteers – there will be no charge. Contact the church office if you need a paper application.

Once you receive this clearance back, either in the mail or on the computer, make a copy and return to the office. Make sure you keep a copy for yourself.
